Thank God for a successful 27th mission trip to Ghana - January 29 to February 28, 2015

We sponsored the 27th mission trip to Ghana from July 16 to August 17, 2015. The team was made up of the following volunteers : Dr. Edem Agamah & Mrs. June Agamah. We were also assisted by a Ghanaian medical team, made up of 3 doctors, Dr. Sylvarius Amuzu, Dr. Eleazar Blasu, Dr. Gospel Atsu Agamah, who performed surgeries. Mrs. Linda Agamah, a nurse anesthetist provided anesthesia services and Mr. Mawuli Kpodo, a perioperative nurse, assisted with updates on Medical Surgical Nursing lectures.

We undertook the following activities:

1. Medical Surgical Nursing Training, with a competency examinations for the nursing staff of the hospital.
2. English and Mathematics Assessment for all members of staff. This also helped us to identify staff members, who will be trained in the future to assume leadership roles.
3. Donated 20 desks to an elementary school at Worgbato, one of the poor villages near Agbozume. IHDN is adopting this school and plan to offer more resources in the future.
4. Treated over 2,452 patients (62% females), and performed surgeries on 42 patients. Most of the patients had malaria, hypertension, and degenerative joint disease, while hernia surgery was the commonest operation done.
5. We donated choir robes to the EP Church at Agbozume
6. Interviewed and recruited staff for the hospital, including a new Nursing Leadership team made up of Ms. Theresa Morgan, (Matron), Ms. Vincentia Hlogbe (Head of Maternity Unit), Ms. Josephine Kudzawu (Head of Surgery).
7. Hosting of staff dinner and retirement ceremony for Ms. Edith Kudowor, Nursing officer, who was honored for her commitment and service to IHDN. She is retiring from active service but will be available for part time duties when needed.
8. Attended church services at Accra Chapel, Korle Bu and Legon Inter-Denomination Church, Legon. These are two of the leading churches in Accra, attended by many doctors and academicians. It is very encouraging to see how God has blessed these churches with resourceful members compared to other churches.

IHDN Mission Hospital Activity update

The hospital treated over 27,873 patients at the end of October 2015. This is slightly lower than the 31,775 patients treated in the same period in 2014. There is a major delay in issuing National Health Insurance cards. Because of that, most patients without a card do not turn up for treatment at the hospital until they are very ill to the point of death. As a result, most patients admitted are critically ill. With no Intensive Care Unit, some of these patients expire either on arrival or just after admission. IHDN is one of the few hospitals in Ghana that treats patients whether or not they have insurance. We also offer emergency treatments even though patients do not have funds to pay. After admission, we ask the family to help reimburse the cost. For some patients this is an impossibility, so we just discharge them. We have tried to raise local funds from churches and groups to help pay for these uninsured patients, but this has not yielded much.

The biggest challenge remains the delay in payment of claims submitted to the National Health Insurance Authority (NHIA). At the time of this writing, we have received payment only for patients treated up to April 2015. We are hope and pray that as the economy improves, the NHIA will be able to pay its bills on time.

The main activities to be undertaken during this trip are:

1. Providing specialized medical and surgical care
2. Assisting with electrical wiring, carpentry and interior work with the 30 unit, 5-story IHDN hospital staff apartment,
3. In-service training in Medical and Surgical Nursing
4. Community Outreach, with Clinics at Worgbato, Lotakor, Taskorner, Nogokpo
5. Tutorials in Internal Medicine & Tropical Medicine
6. Dietary and Nutritional Training for Nurses
7. Pharmacy and Dispensary Management
8. Assisting with planning and administration of the hospital

Please pray with us as we undertake this trip. Pray for the Ghanaian team coming to help us and the people we seek to serve. Pray that in all these God's name will be glorified

Update on Construction of IHDN Staff Apartment & Roads

As at October, 2015, plastering work on the ground floor has been completed. We are yet to install doors, windows, wiring, plumbing and cabinets to allow for occupancy of the ground floor. We hope to complete this by the early parts of 2016 to allow some of the staff to move there. As at the end of September 2015, we have spent about \$342,857, including concrete floor for the 3rd floor and partially completed access road. The building has been redesigned to add another floor to the building to make it a 5 floors with 30 units. We are also praying and asking our friends and well-wishers to help support this project, estimated at \$600-800,000.

IHDN to Host 5th Fundraising Banquet in Springfield

We will host the 5th Fundraising banquet on March 18, 2016 in Springfield, IL. This annual event entitled, "Bringing the world together" will seek to raise \$100,000 in support of the building of the staff apartment and road construction. Since 2012, we have raised \$233,898 at the 4 events we held. These funds have helped us to pay for a back-up generator, complete the inpatient wards and started the Staff apartment. We thank all those who volunteered and also donated funds towards these projects. We will appreciate your continued support.

IHDN to start Labor & Delivery Services

Safe delivery is a luxury in most parts of the developing world. The Agbozume/Klikor/Weta area is no stranger to this situation.

Since 2008, when we opened our doors, we have noted an increase in the demand for hospital bed for pregnant women with acute illness. They are usually admitted with malaria, anemia, hypertension and diabetes. When they improve and discharged, they are lost to follow up, because we do not presently provide delivery services. That is about to change beginning 2016.

We are remodeling existing space in the courtyard to create a 10 - bed maternity ward. We are also converting the private wards into labor and delivery rooms and an operating room. We have obtained and shipped supplies including fetal Doppler, Delivery bed, Vacuum delivery kit, surgical instruments and phototherapy unit.

Medical Supplies Shipped to Ghana

We shipped a 40 ft container to Ghana on Nov 19, 2015. The shipment included furniture, surgical and medical equipment, school desks and books. The cost of the container is \$4,143. We received support from the Midwest Mission Distribution Center, obtained supplies from Hospital Sisters Mission Outreach, Memorial Medical Center, Passavant Area Hospital and In His Service Jesus is Lord. We thank all those who supported this effort. Even though most of the items are used, donated, with minimal resale values, IHDN still pays duties and port charges in Ghana. This is usually higher than the cost of shipment. We would appreciate your help in paying these fees after the container arrives in Ghana.
