IHDN concludes another successful mission trip to Ghana

IHDN sponsored another successful mission trip to Ghana from June 24-July 28, 2009. This was the 16th mission trip to Ghana. The list of volunteers and their activities were published in the June 2009 Newsletter. In this edition, we summarize the activities of the Ghana team.

One of major highlights of the trip was the celebration of the 1-year anniversary of the IHDN Mission Hospital and a Health Fair at Weta. Over 500 people, including Lt. Col. (Rtd) Cyril Necku, Deputy Volta Regional Minister and Dr. Andrews Ayim, the Ketu District Director of Health, attended this ceremony. This is now the second major hospital in the Ketu North district, with a catchment area of about 30-40,000 people. We also conducted a cross sectional study on hypertension (See article).

IHDN sponsors the training of Nurse Anesthesiologist

Mr. Marcellinus Djreke, one of the founding nurses of the hospital, has decided to pursue further training as a nurse anesthesiologist. IHDN is sponsoring his 2-year training at a cost of about \$10,000. Marcellinus is 27 years old, married with a son. This training will help us increase the surgical care we provide currently at the hospital.

IHDN Ghana Mission team visits the US

We hosted Mr. Mark Dedzoe, Acting Administrator, IHDN Mission Hospital Ghana and Mr. Cephas Agbelie, Treasurer, IHDN Ghana, from October 14 to December 7, 2009. The main focus of this visit was to present IHDN's work at the Global Missions Health Conference in Louisville, KY. They presented a report at the IHDN Board Meeting and to the body of Christ at Hope Church, Springfield. They also used this opportunity to tour various health care institutions in Central Illinois and learn about how health care is delivered in the US. They visited several friends and supporters and also visited farms to observe mechanized farming. They have since returned home safely. We thank all who helped make their trip a successful one.

Karen McCord Memorial Fund Supports IHDN

We received \$850 as donations in memory of Mrs. Karen McCord, who passed away this year. We also received a Public Service Announcement spot on the TV in her memory. We are very thankful for all who donated. May the Lord Bless you.

IHDN to establish a Radio station in Ghana

IHDN will be applying to the Ghana National Communication Authority for a license to operate an FM Radio station in Ghana. This station will be used for Health & Science Education, Christian outreach and promoting Community Development. Please pray alongside with us on this project, which is estimated to cost over \$30,000.

University of Iowa student studies hypertension in Ghana

Mr. Ben Henkle, a Masters in Public Health student from the University of Iowa, in Iowa City, conducted a research project to study the prevalence of hypertension, obesity and its relationship with socioeconomic factors including family history and poverty in Southeastern Ghana. Data collection was done on **269 subjects** selected from the following locations: IHDN Mission Hospital at Weta, Worgbato (a village, 3 miles from Agbozume), Agbozume Market, Ketu District Hospital, Aflao and the Sacred Heart Catholic Hospital in Abor. The tools used for this research were the Welch Allyn blood pressure monitor, an analogue weighing scale, height meter, and a 4 page questionnaire.

The major findings were:

- a) Only 56% of subjects were aware of their diagnosis of hypertension,
- b) Only 54% of these subjects were treated. Hypertension was controlled in only 22%.
- c) Subjects were not significantly overweight, with 77% having a BMI <30 and few reported being diabetic (3%) or smoking (3%)
- d) Approximately a third of the subjects reported family history of hypertension (35%),

IHDN will use this knowledge to increase the awareness of hypertension and its management.

IHDN represented at the Global Missions Health Conference, Louisville, KY

We attended the Global Missions Health Conference in Louisville, KY from November 12-14, 2009. The Global Missions Health Conference is held each year at Louisville's Southeast Christian Church. The aim is to inform, train, and equip health care professionals and students to use their medical skills to further God's kingdom while sharing the Gospel with those in need on both the international and domestic mission fields. We had several inquiries about IHDN's work in Ghana and interacted with several people involved in Christian Health Ministries.

IHDN Mission Hospital accredited by Ghana Hospital Board; National Health Insurance Approval awaited

The IHDN Mission Hospital recently received the long awaited accreditation from the Ghana Private Hospital and Maternity Board. With this, we are now eligible to participate in the National Health Insurance Scheme. We have submitted our application and had a hospital site inspection by a team from Accra. We are currently waiting for the certification from the Insurance Board.

IHDN Hospital runs a deficit pending insurance approval

Since its opening in June 2008, the IHDN Mission Hospital has operated in the red. Patients attending the hospital pay a small fee for their care, usually less than \$2. Monthly collections approximate \$3,200, while our expenses, mainly salaries, supplies and operating cost exceed almost \$5,000. Although 60-70 % of the population is now covered under the National Health Insurance Scheme in Ghana, we are not able to see these patients at the Hospital, let alone generate operating revenue. While this is not all bad, (because insurance bills are not paid promptly by the Scheme, taking not less than 3-4months), we need to be able to see all these patients. Please pray for quick processing of our documents. Please also pray that we would be able to have the funds to support the work pending the approval from the Insurance Scheme.
