IHDN TO HELP GHANA ESTABLISH A CANCER REGISTRY

IHDN is leading an effort to establish a cancer registry in Ghana. During the upcoming mission trip in July, Drs. Agamah and Imeokparia will be hosting a training workshop at the Korle Bu Teaching Hospital and help establish a computerized cancer registry. The need to establish the registry has been in the discussion phase for years, with interest expressed in the project by the Ministry of Health and WHO. IHDN seeks to help people help themselves in the name of God. When we started the Health and Development Institute in 1998, we built it around dedicated volunteers who are willing to teach people and transfer technology to Africa. Because Dr. Imeokparia has volunteered to help in Ghana, we are seizing the opportunity and directing her expertise to where it is most needed, hence this new initiative.

We are thankful for the opportunity to help in this area. A good cancer registry will document the burden of cancer and eventually help improve cancer care in Ghana. Rotary Foundation of Evanston, Illinois is covering the expenses of Dr. Imeokparia's portion of the trip. We thank the Rotarians for their support. We are raising funds to buy software and pay for supplies. Please pray that this effort will be sustained after we leave Ghana. Pray for wisdom and guidance as we teach. Pray that we will be able to raise \$2,000 to help pay for software and other supplies needed for the training.

CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP AND DISCIPLESHIP TRAINING TO BE HELD IN GHANA

Our Health and Development Institute provide training in Christian Leadership and Discipleship in July. We will also hold marriage seminars. We will be focusing on the volunteers at the project site and members of the Health and Development clubs. We believe that training on "how to give away your faith" and imparting Christian values will help strengthen the Christian outreach work of IHDN at Agbozume. Please pray that God opens the hearts of the people to receive the truth.

RESOURCE MOBILIZATION FOR SANITATION & ROAD CONSTRUCTION (SRC)

We are planning to launch a resource mobilization campaign in Ghana this summer to help us with the Sanitation and Roads Construction program at the IHDN project site. The major road at Agbozume, leading to IHDN project site needs to be repaired and paved. Previously, villagers used garbage to fill potholes but with IHDN education this has stopped. We are promoting environmental health and proper sanitation. A good road to the Family Medical Center is one of the projects we have identified. Preliminary estimate of the project is \$43,000. The villagers are being asked to contribute their share and seek outside help from friends and family. We will appreciate contributions from our friends to make this project a reality. If completed, this road will change the quality of life of the people. It will reduce disease bearing dust particles from settling on food and other surfaces in nearby homes.

DONATED MEDICAL & DENTAL SUPPLIES SENT TO GHANA

On April 7, 2001, a dedicated and highly motivated group of volunteers came together to help us load a 40-foot container with donated medical and dental supplies, which were shipped to Ghana. Such was the outpouring of enthusiasm that it took us only two hours to transfer the goods from our storage area to the container. To say, that "many hands make light work" would be a bit of an understatement. We would like to acknowledge the sacrifice of those who volunteered to pack and catalogue supplies and load the container.
