### AGBOZUME FAMILY MEDICAL CENTER HAS FULL-TIME PHYSICIAN

In our last newsletter we reported that Dr. Randy Sepenu was recruited as the physician in charge of the IHDN Family Medical Center in Agbozume beginning November 1, 1998. We are pleased to inform you that Randy has begun his practice as scheduled. The first month has gone quite well and Randy is adjusting to his new role. We are pleased to introduce Dr. Sepenu to you.

#### DR. RANDY SEPENU JOINS IHDN PROJECT

Dr. Randy Sepenu was trained at the University of Ghana Medical School from 1991-1997. He then pursued an internship in General Surgery and Pediatrics before joining IHDN.

Randy is a believer in the Lord Jesus. He desires to use his skills in a career that has to do with the work of God. He believes he has found that in IHDN and the Family Medical Center in Agbozume. This project, he feels, is the answer God has provided.

Randy communicated his commitment to the IHDN Board in Ghana and in the United States recently. He made his decision carefully and plans to spend a year or two with the project before embarking on further medical studies.

On weekends, Randy is involved with his church, Lighthouse Chapel, in Accra. He is working with a new choir for the church which started just over two months ago. Randy helps with the sound control and needs to be in Accra almost every weekend for choir rehearsals. He hopes when the choir is more established that he will be able to spend more weekends at Agbozume, helping the local church.

## FAMILY MEDICAL CENTER IN OPERATION FOR ONE MONTH



The Agbozume Family Medical Center welcomed Dr. Randy Sepenu on Monday, November 2, 1998.

On his first day at the center, Dr. Sepenu saw 50 patients. This was a special day promoted in the community as an Open House and Free Clinic. In the remaining weeks of November, there have been about 20 patients seen per day, with the numbers picking up gradually. Dr. Randy has performed mainly minor procedures and wound debridements.

A nurse is yet to be recruited. Randy is working currently with one clerk. Some of the Community Health Workers that were trained in the summer are assisting with blood pressure measurements and registration.

Medical supplies for the first month were mainly leftovers from the summer Health Fair, supplemented with local purchases of essential drugs here and there. Now, most of the essential drugs are running out, so a major purchase is being planned. Randy and the Ghanaian Board are looking for the best and most economical source for procuring the needed supplies.

Randy has started building relationships with the chiefs and community leaders. He will soon be meeting with the doctors at Aflao, Dzodze and Ho Hospitals.

We are also researching an affordable way to have e-mail accessibility at the Center. Presently, e-mail is received and sent through the communications center in Accra for a somewhat reasonable cost. The difficulty is getting the type of telephone systems needed for e-mail service to be installed at the project site.

#### PRAY WITH US

Please pray for RANDY. He is the first full-time physician to be stationed at Agbozume providing medical care. He is also the project leader for the Christian Community Health Program. He needs wisdom and guidance from above. Pray for guidance as he develops relationships with the community and the leaders, both religious and traditional.

Please pray for Randy as he works to develop a BUDGET for the project site and the Community Health Program. We are praying that he will be able to raise enough money to pay staff salaries and the overhead, estimated at about \$1,000 per month.




As we enter 1999, we are privileged to share with you the preliminary summary of our Financial Report for 1/1/98 through 9/30/98.
